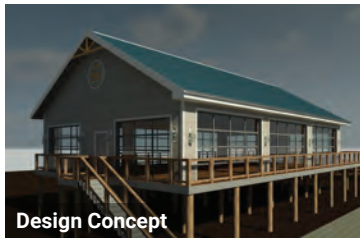


NEW PROJECTS
